ASPCA's 5 Springtime Plants that are Toxic to Pets

Spring has sprung! If you're anything like us, you're itching to start gardening; however, keep in mind that a number of popular springtime plants can be poisonous to pets. To ensure you cultivate a danger-free zone for your furry friends, we've put together a list of five common toxic springtime flowers.

Azalea/Rhododendron:



Members of the Rhododendron species (also known as azalea) contain substances known

as grayantoxins, can produce vomiting, drooling, weakness, depression of the central nervous system, and diarrhea in animals. Severe azalea poisoning can even lead to death from cardiovascular collapse.

Chrysanthemum: These popular blooms contains pyrethrins which are a natural insecticide.

If eaten, chrysanthemums may cause gastrointestinal upset including drooling, vomiting, and diarrhea. Depression and loss of coordination may also develop if enough of the plant is consumed.



Daffodil: Yes, even these harbingers of spring can cause vomiting, salivation, and diarrhea when ingested. Large

ingestions can lead to convulsions, low blood pressure, tremors, and cardiac arrhythmias.

Beware: bulbs are the most poisonous part!

Lily: While lilies are not toxic to dogs, they are very dangerous for cats. Ingesting even a small amount of a lily plant can lead to severe kidney damage to your feline friend.



Tulip: The entire tulip plant is toxic but it is the bulb that is the most poisonous to animals. Eating tulips can cause vomiting, depression, diarrhea, and hypersalivation.
