How to Get Your Dog to Stop Digging

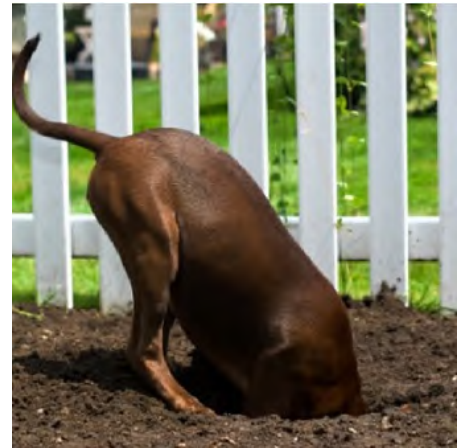
Has your dog turned your yard into a moonscape, with craters everywhere? If so, what you should know is that your dog isn't doing this out of spite or a desire to destroy your landscaping. One reason might be that he needs comfort or protection.

In hot weather, dogs may dig holes to lie in the cool dirt. In winter they may dig to provide themselves with shelter from cold/wind/rain. If you observe the following, your dog may be digging for comfort or protection:

- The holes are near the foundations of buildings, large shade trees, or a water source;
- Your dog doesn't have a shelter such as a dog house or shelter is exposed to the hot sun or cold winds;
- Your dog is lying in the holes she digs.

What to do:

- Provide your dog with the comfort or protection she seeks;
- Bring your dog indoors more often to relieve overheating or a chill.
- Take precautions to keep your dog safe in extreme heat or cold.
- Make sure your dog has a comfortable doghouse that offers protection from wind and sun.
- Provide plenty of fresh water in a bowl that can't be tipped over.
- If your dog still prefers lying in a hole in the ground, try providing a digging zone that is protected from the elements.
